Are We There Yet?

For I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord, plans for welfare and not for evil, to give you a future and a hope.

~~ Jeremiah 29:11 ~~

Are we there yet? It is a familiar refrain to any parent who has packed up the kids and taken to the open highway for a family vacation. When my daughter Rachel was in preschool, she was liable to give voice to this question within the first 15 minutes of what might be a fourto-seven-hour trip, depending on the amount of traffic on the New Jersey Turnpike. To help her understand how long the trip would be, I would calculate the length of time by how many times she could watch the Disney animated movie Aladdin before we reached our destination. It runs 90 minutes. When Rachel would ask are we almost there? I could say, Aladdin is trapped in the cave of Wonders now or Aladdin is taking Jasmine on a magic carpet ride. For Rachel having something familiar for comparison to the length of the trip helped curb her anxiety.

Right now, we are on a slightly different kind of adventure. It has been a long arduous trip so far. We don't know when the pandemic will end or what that end will look like. We all want to know, "Are we there yet?" Is now the time we can take off our masks? Is now the time we can resume singing in the sanctuary? Can we shake hands and give hugs? Are we there yet?

Perhaps a better question would be, "How can we reach our hoped-for destination?" We all want to reach the same destination. We want life to be more like it was before we ever heard of COVID or paid much attention to corona viruses. The SARS-CoV-2 virus, has the ability to mutate. Multiple sources say, the more widely a virus can spread, the more opportunities it has to mutate. If the U.S. and ultimately the world don't vaccinate a sufficient percentage of the population, we'll be setting ourselves up to let the virus keep spreading, and keep mutating, creating new variants. Some of those new variants might get past current vaccines.

There is one sure way to get back to something approaching normal and that is for as many people as possible to be vaccinated against COVID-19. Right now, over 85 million people in the United States have been fully vaccinated which is roughly 25%. At this time in Virginia, anyone over the age of 16 is eligible to be vaccinated. I know that not everyone wants to be vaccinated. Many people have doubts about going ahead and getting the vaccine. If you have doubts, I would encourage you to consult reputable sites like CDC.gov or the Virginia Health Department (<u>https://</u> www.vdh.virginia.gov/).

There is probably more false than factual information circulating about the virus and about vaccinations. To significantly curtail the virus, we need to reach herd immunity which means 65-80% of people would need to have immunity. Immunity comes from being vaccinated. We aren't there yet, but I hope we will be soon. Until then, wear a mask in public spaces, wash your hands frequently and continue to stay 6 feet apart from others; but do dare to hope. Together we will get to that place where we can sing, hug and have fellowship, all without masks.

A big THANK YOU to everyone who contributed goodies for Valley Mission. I took a trunk load to Valley Mission last week and they were very appreciative for all the donations of cleaners, wipes, aluminum foil, detergent, plastic baggies, lunch bags, gloves, umbrellas, etc.

We are still taking donations for the Green Hanger Project all year. Make sure to label your box or bag with "Green Hanger". Do your spring cleaning and donate those gently used items. No holes or stains, please. You can also donate personal hygiene items, such as shampoo, conditioner, deodorant, body wash, toothbrush, toothpaste, pads, etc.

On Saturday, April 10th, Harrisonburg offered a RAM clinic. RAM (Remote Area Medical) is a major nonprofit provider of free pop-up clinics. Their mission is to prevent pain and alleviate suffering by providing free, quality healthcare to those in need. They deliver free dental, vision, and medical services to underserved and uninsured individuals. We donated \$200 towards this event. After the event, we received a thank you from the group and said they helped 443 patients that one day. So, thank you to everyone who donates to the Adult Mission fund because we can help those that need it.

Mission Project of the Month: First Step: A Response to Domestic Violence dedicates services to providing emergency shelter and support to individuals and families in crisis because of domestic violence, dating violence, or family violence. First Step's services are client driven, trauma informed, empowering, and safety oriented to meet the needs of individuals and their children. First Step's services include a 24-Hour Crisis Hotline, Emergency Shelter, Individualized Safety Planning, Voluntary Case Management, Advocacy, Support Group, and Court Accompaniment. All services at First Step are available in English and Spanish. This is one of our funds that we contribute to because we know they need help, especially with more cases since COVID-19 hit last year. Last May we had this big black cloud called COVID-19 hanging over us. We were just a few months in and thought we would see the sunshine by fall. Well ... an entire year has gone by with that black cloud still hanging over us. It is getting a little less threatening. We have seen little glimmers of sun light. But we yearn for complete sunshine.

When that black cloud lifts completely letting the sun come out and warm our bodies and souls, what an amazing day that will be! But, how much of our world will no longer look the same?
