From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Bethany UMC Family,

One of the things I have learned in my young life is that tomorrow is never promised, and the future is never clear. Now who holds the future, and the present is a completely different story. This July will be four years since I survived being shot in Durham, NC. In one instance, I learned how quickly life can change in a dime. I also learned that there are things we love and hold valuable to us one day, but those things might change another day. One day your family, friends, and faith are the most important things; and then the next day it is walking, breathing without a ventilator, and sitting up in a bed that brings joy and value to your day. Nowadays each day I wake up, I know that there is purpose. I know that I am living on borrowed time. But the thing is, we all are living on borrowed time. Each day we breathe and walk this Earth, we have the potential to be Kingdom builders. And one of those things I have learned is to celebrate the wins. Celebrate the joy when someone surrenders their life to Christ. Celebrate the joy when someone overcomes addiction. Celebrate the joy when a child reads a bible passage in front of the congregation. Celebrate the joy when God's people come together to do something special and powerful!

The biggest joy we get to celebrate is this church family being a faithful witness to Jesus for 70 years! We are reminded that we are to celebrate the joys of God, and this my friends is a big joy. 70 years' worth of leading

folks to Jesus, 70 years of baptisms and confirmation, 70 years of loving on the people of Weyers Cave, and don't forget the 70 years' worth of potlucks (praise God for good cooks and good food)! Remembering Our Past, As We Anticipate The Future



My Years at Bethany UMC by Pastor Jim Harris

In April 1975, Eugene Woolridge, the Harrisonburg District Superintendent, said he was going to appoint me to serve a part-time charge of two churches in Burketown, Bethany and Pleasant Grove UMCs. Here I was, a young, inexperienced man – a Navy vet, college sophomore and K-mart employee - and I was going to be a pastor.

I had to wait until I completed License to Preach School, so I began my ministry Monday, July 21st, and preached my first sermon as a pastor on Sunday, July 27th. Because Annual Conference had already taken place, I served that first year as a "Supply Pastor," which meant it didn't count as a year under appointment.

The five years I spent at the Burketown Charge yielded many blessings. I went from a part-time supply pastor to what we then called a full-time Deacon, now known as a Provisional Elder. We went from living in a small apartment to living in a brand-new parsonage. We had forged lasting friendships, buried dear church members, welcomed new lives, baptized children, youth and adults and ministered to the hurt and suffering.

One of the highlights of my time there was the beginning of the prison ministry that grew to become Kingsway Prison and Family Outreach. This began from a desire of the Bethany United Methodist Women to send Christmas cards to the inmates at Harrisonburg Camp 8. From that humble desire I became a Bible study leader at Camp 8 with church members accompanying me. Two of those members were Shelton and Louise Jennings. They had a passion for that ministry like no others, and when I decided to move, I asked them to take over the Bible study... and look what happened!

In June of 1980, just short of five years spent as the pastor of Bethany and Pleasant Grove, my family and I packed a rented U-Haul and our VW van and headed for Tulsa, Oklahoma, and three

years of seminary at the ORU School of Theology. It was not easy to leave. Tears were shed. Doubts about the decision to do this lingered. But there was also excitement and anticipation.

It is rare that a pastor gets to serve the same congregation twice, but I was blessed to be able to do just that. I was asked to fill in at Bethany for six months after their pastor was unable to continue. I started on January 11, 2009, and it was like going home after being away at college or in the service. It was the same address, the same building, and many of the same people, but there were also many changes, which is not surprising after 30 years.

By the time I returned, Bethany and Pleasant Grove had merged into one congregation and the church had added an addition with a half-gym/fellowship hall, and classrooms. When I was there in the 1970's the pastor's office was in the parsonage, now it was in the church, and there was an administrative assistant. And of course there were many new faces, and lots of children and youth.

I am grateful to God that I could return briefly to my first church. Bethany UMC is much like a parent to me. They got me off to a good start; their love, patience, teaching and encouragement have helped to guide my entire ministry.

The youth spent a wonderful week serving Dickenson County, VA in the Appalachia Mountains. We worked with the

organization Appalachia Service Project and were with 7 other church groups. We stayed at Clintwood Elementary in a partitioned off gym-one side women and one side men. Our day started at 7:15 AM with wake up and devotions. After breakfast, we headed to our family's worksite. It was about 20 minutes away and literally on the side of the mountain. Our family had 4 boys, all under the age of 11. Our work week consisted of building stairs, railing, and pickets on the back of the trailer home and then a 7 foot high staircase, railing, and pickets for the front porch. Since we were unable to rebuild the front porch, we replaced reinforcing posts, pickets, and deck boards. The evenings were filled with much needed showers in the shower trailers, dinner, evening programs, and recreational games outside. A couple of days we got to explore Breaks

Interstate Park and Bear Pen public pool. Since the school was not air conditioned, fans proved to bring some comfort. We may have been a small group of six people, but we served the community well. Mission trip members
