Desk . . .

Dear Beloved Bethany Family,

As the heat continues to bear down on us here in the Valley, we also know the temperature of our country seems to be at an all time high, after an assassination attempt of former President Trump and the upcoming election in November. With that being said, I wanted to share this letter from the UMC Council of Bishops, which make up all of the United Methodist Bishops in the United States. I hope this letter is encouraging, and helps all of us look inwards before we respond outwardly. May we even more now, than before, live into being "God's agents as healers, peacemakers, and bridge builders in a troubled and hurting world.

Council of Bishops The United Methodist Church Press Release for immediate release July 16, 2024

"Following the recent assassination attempt on former President Donald J. Trump, the world is in deep sorrow and reflection. We absolutely condemn this act of violence. As people of faith, we are called to love one another and follow the example of Jesus Christ, who showed us the way to love, peace, and reconciliation. Christ calls us to be peacemakers in a world that often resorts to hate, violence, and division.

The polarization of political beliefs has created a divided world that often breeds discord. As United Methodists, we are committed to seeking non-violent ways to resolve our differences. We denounce all acts of hatred and violence against groups or individuals. We are called to resist the temptation to engage in such acts and speech and commit to the work of compassion, peace, and unity.

As Christ's followers, we are called to be healers in our churches, communities, countries, and the world. In these times of political tension and disagreement, we must remember our shared humanity, the sacred worth, and the inherent dignity of every person.

It is at times like this that God is calling us to renew our commitment to non-violence and remember our baptism vows, which urge us to renounce the spiritual forces of wickedness, reject the evil powers of this world, and repent of our sin. Our baptism vows compel us to accept the freedom and power that God gives us to resist evil, injustice, and oppression in whatever forms they present themselves.

We urge all United Methodists to denounce the divisive rhetoric and violence pervading our society and work towards creating paths of reconciliation, dialogue, and nonviolent solutions to our differences.

May we love one another and build bridges towards peace and unity.

We pray for former President Trump, his family, and all those affected by this tragic event. We also extend our heartfelt prayers to the families of those who were injured and those who lost their lives in this senseless act of violence. May God's comforting presence be with them in their time of need. May God grant us grace to be God's agents as healers, peacemakers, and bridge builders in a troubled and hurting world.

We look forward to the day when all people "shall beat their swords into plowshares, and their spears into pruning hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war anymore." (Isaiah 2:4)"

MY YEARS AT BETHANY (1996-2006) by Pastor Don Hawks

To all the saints at Bethany: Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. (Philippians 3:2)

I was appointed to serve as pastor to Bethany during the summer of 1996 and it became my honor to serve for 10 years at Bethany ... the longest pastoral tenure in the church's history thus far. As I prepared this reflection, I began thinking about the many individuals and families

who were a part of the congregation during that time. I thought of the many people with whom I served in the various ministry areas, the times we came together in worship services, and the numerous opportunities to serve others through my pastoral care. I loved every individual at Bethany regardless of whether we totally agreed or disagreed-or somewhere in between-on issues and challenges we faced together as a congregation. As I ponder my years at Bethany and the years since, this scripture comes to mind: I thank my God every time I remember you, constantly praying with joy in every one of my prayers for all of you, because of your sharing in the gospel from the first day until now. (Philippians 3:3-5 NRSV)

My years at Bethany were not without conflicts and controversy at times. We made mistakes and needed to learn from those mistakes. Yet through it all, we tried to seize these challenges as opportunities for growth and change. For the most part, these challenges led to positive outcomes. Thus, I have chosen to focus on the positive outcomes and experiences.

During my time at Bethany, leadership discussed and explored ways to clearly define a purpose-driven mission and vision of the church. As part of that process, we attempted to set achievable goals. We talked and prayed together about how to grow in the service of Christ as individual members and as a congregation. The result was an increase in community outreach and nurturing our own spiritual lives through small groups and ministry opportunities.

One result of the leadership development was that we sensed the need to add a second worship service. Our goals for adding the service were to reach out to those outside of the church building and to present the good



news of Jesus in a relevant and meaningful way. After time researching, praying and planning, we concluded that the best approach to accomplish this goal was to design a contemporary approach to the worship experience. The response to the service was beyond my wildest expectations beginning on the first Sunday we launched the service. The process of this service was not without challenges at times. It seemed initially we took three steps forward and ten steps backward, but because of the commitment of dedicated worship and music leaders who believed we were following the mission of

the church, we were able to move forward. These twenty some years later, the contemporary approach to worship continues to thrive at Bethany.

As I see it, the establishment of the new worship service gave us the opportunity to reach out to people moving into the new development of the nearby Harshbarger subdivision. Our witness ministry made a concerted effort to welcome our new neighbors. As a result, several individuals and families from that development became a part of Bethany and many of those persons still serve in ministry at Bethany today.

For me, one of the most exciting aspects of worship and outreach is when we moved our worship services for a couple of Christmas seasons and an Easter service to the Weyers Cave Community Center to include musical multimedia presentations. I was again blown away by the response to these events by both the congregation and the community. We were able to reach out to many people from the community who attended the services.

What I present here is only a small part of all that we accomplished together during my ten years at Bethany. We also made significant strides with building and grounds projects, including the parking lot expansion. It was a sad time as I moved to a new appointment in 2006, but I was gratified at how we were a small part of the greater church's attempt to carry out the great commission of Jesus.

As during my time at Bethany, today I urge the Bethany congregation to continue to discern how to carry out that

Great Commission. I like the way Jesus' charge to his followers is expressed

in The Message paraphrase: "God authorized and commanded me to commission you: Go out and train everyone you meet, far and near, in this way of life, marking them by baptism in the threefold name: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Then instruct them in the practice of all I have commanded you. I'll be with you as you do this, day after day after day, right up to the end of the age" (Matthew 28:19-20).



Dear Bethany friends,

I thank God every

time I think of you, for the first time we met way back in 2009, for our seven years of active ministry together, and for the eight years since I have been gone.

I hold in my heart many fond memories of our time together, from youth mission trips to monthly Young at Hearts lunches, from JAM Sessions with the children to Sunday school and weekly worship. I am proud of the small groups that we developed as a way to disciple one another in the ministry of Jesus Christ, and the food pantry that we established which fed thousands of people in the six short years that we shared that work together.

Congratulations on your 70th anniversary! I am so grateful that I have been able to be a small part of the Bethany story.

The church we love so much has come a long way from Naked Creek. You have grown in faith and in people numbers. You have added new ministries and reached new people. And yet some of the most important things have not changed at all: the loveliness of the congregation, the commitment to the mission, and the proclamation of the gospel of Jesus Christ.

I wish you another 70 years of faithfulness. May the seeds that you plant today bear fruit for generations to come, until the great day when Jesus returns to raise all the saints from the dead and we meet once again in God's heaven.

In the meantime, let me encourage you with the words of Paul to the Colossians:

Therefore, as you received Christ Jesus the Lord, so walk in him, rooted and built up in him and established in the faith, just as you were taught, abounding in thanksgiving. (2:6-7).

The peace of Christ be with you, now and always.




